DISCERNMENT

The Latin root of the verb "to discern" means to discriminate.

Thus, in the Christian spiritual tradition, discernment refers to the process of sifting out what is of God, discriminating between that which expresses God's call and anything that runs counter to it.

Prayer of Examen

The Prayer of Examen and discernment are related because they both rely on careful discrimination and choices about how to live our lives.

Spiritual discernment is a gift from God

It also includes an intentional attempt on our part to hear God's call in our life. Prayer of Examen

It takes work; it is also a matter of grace.

Devotional Life

It involves our full humanity as well as communion with God. Prayer, study, scripture, meditation, reflection, being in touch with our senses, listening, silence, tradition, experience.

Discerning a Calling

Discernment helps a person understand the source of a call, to whom it is directed, its content, and what response is appropriate

Discernment also involves learning if one is dodging a call, is deaf to a call, or is rejecting a call.

Patterns in Discerning

We should notice patterns of attraction and repulsion when contemplating our choices and especially how we are being drawn by recurrent deep desires and experiences of consolation – that is the gifts of the spirit.

Discernment does not imply fully comprehending God's will, but rather it raises the question: What is the next step God wants me to take? (Listening Hearts, page 26)

- Usually involves service or benefit to others
- Confirmation (praying with others/prayer partners)
